The Year 9 students took part in the "Dragons' Den" Ice Cream Project during two days of Enrichment Week as a House competition. They had the week to prepare a presentation which included making the ice cream they had designed for the Dragons to test. They were assessed on their good use of PowerPoint and use of persuasive arguments and confident presentation skills that had been developed through IT and English sessions; detailed costings for setting up, breaking even, and projected profits from sales from Maths sessions; design ideas for logos and packaging in IT; their explanation of the science behind their method of making the ice cream from science.



Tuesday 12th July

Whilst the Year 8's were on a castle trip, Year 7's got involved with percussion, psychology, and art-based activities. The professional drummer ... taught some of our students how to play different types of drums.

On Tuesday afternoon each group did their presentation for their House and a winner was selected to go through to pitch their ice cream to the Dragons in the final.
