One of the biggest frustrations over this term has been that we have had to restrict the number of clubs and trips we would like to be running. These are an important part of the education and memories students make whilst at school and so many have missed out due to the restrictions of the last two years. As you will appreciate the rise in Covid infection rates over this month has meant that the risk assessment of all enrichment opportunities are constantly being updated to reflect this changing context. This uncertainty also affects the insurance cover available, coupled with the

different and evolving legislation in different countries, and has meant (like the vast majority of schools nationally) that we won't be able to run as many trips abroad in 2022.

We are however, excited to share with you our plans to relaunch Enrichment week over the coming weeks. Included in this offer will be some residential and day trips within the UK where we will do our best to make provision for as many students as we can, within the constraints of our time, staff and covid related risk assessments.

I have received some feedback regarding trips and visits this week from parents that have been upset that their child has not been able to secure a place. There will inevitably be situations in which demand for some of the opportunities we are running will exceed the number of places available – particularly following two years of limited opportunity. Whilst this is disappointing, please remember that staff are running these trips voluntarily out of a desire to provide for our students.

Late bus

Unfortunately the restrictions to clubs and after school interventions there are not currently sufficient numbers of students to make the late bus viable. Therefore we are suspending the late bus that leaves school at 4:30pm Mon-Thurs. We will re-evaluate this in January - please look out for information in the New Year.

We are delighted to welcome Olaf as the newest member of the Chosen Hill team. Olaf is a Pets as Therapy (PAT) dog and will be based in our Hub some days during the week.
