Grammar and Translation 	Go onto BBC Bitesize for Edexcel GCSE German and complete 2 sections per week, focusing on what you feel least confident on. Keep a record of which sections you've completed and your scores in the quizzes: GCSE German - Edexcel - BBC Bitesize	Ensure you are confident with all of the GCSE grammar topics ready to build on this knowledge at A Level. Film/Literature 	Research the film "Good bye Lenin" by Wolfgang Becker (2003) and make notes in English on the: 1. Historical context of the film 2. Plot 3. Main characters 4.
